CROSSING: Overseas, the Bazadaise is mainly used for crossing. In England, they are crossed with dairy cattle, it's calving ability and the fast growth rate of heifers and calves make it a good breed for this kind of crossing.

It's excellent adjustment in mountains allow it to be crossed in Spain with local breeds such as the Tudanca and the Storiana. In Australia they are crossed with the Brahman breed, the bazadaise is appreciated for it's resistance to insects and heat, and it's calving ability.
